HUMANITIES CITIZENSHIP INITIATIVE (HCI)

JULY 9 – 26, 2018

Carthage College offers a three-week seminar in the study of the humanities and citizenship. Students entering Grade 12 are invited to explore great ideas in authors such as Plato, Shakespeare, and Frederick Douglass, examining civic concepts from the ancient world to contemporary times. Through this seminar, students will read complex material carefully and critically, engage in discussion and debate, and present their own ideas in argumentative writing and classroom discussion. Field trips to Chicago and Milwaukee provide opportunities to discuss seminar ideas in life of the city.

A sample daily schedule includes:

7:45 a.m. – Shuttle pickup from Kenosha pick-up site, transportation to Carthage College

8:00 a.m. – Breakfast in the Carthage dining commons

9:00 a.m. - Seminar and Discussion

Noon – Lunch in the Carthage dining commons

1:00 p.m. – Seminar and Discussion

2:30 p.m. – Mentor Workshops

4:30 p.m. – Shuttles return students to Kenosha drop-off site.

The HCI program scholarship covers all program costs, including:

- Program tuition
- Breakfast and lunch daily
- Transportation to and from Carthage from a Kenosha site
- All necessary learning supplies, including books
- All field trip costs, including travel and ticket fees
